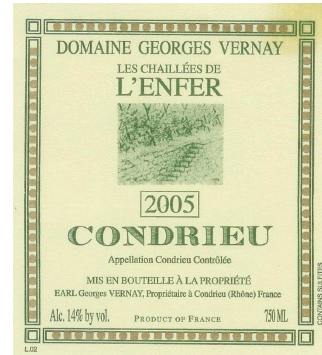

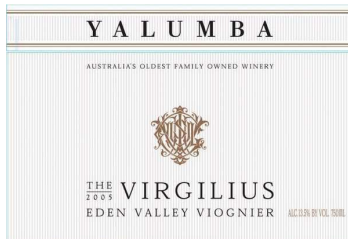
## From oblivion to stardom:

The newest grape to be admitted into the pantheon of France's greatest whites, the rise of Viognier has been astounding. But not accidental. Were it not so difficult to cultivate, wine lovers would probably have discovered it sooner. But such as it is, this was not to be, and it has only been over the last dozen years that Viognier has become so successful.



It originally hails from the Northern Rhône, grown to perfection in Condrieu. The best examples are truly unique, all perfume and creamy headiness, with stunning aromas of ripe apricots, nectarines, lemon blossom, white flowers, and honeysuckle. These days, however, Viognier is found in many other winegrowing regions worldwide, performing best in places warm enough for it to properly ripen.

Aside from Condrieu and the single-estate appellation of Château Grillet (also located in the Northern Rhône), in the rest of France the vast majority of Viognier is grown in Languedoc-Roussillon. Many such bottlings are well priced and refreshing. It is also grown throughout various parts of Italy and Spain, though quality here will vary from the appreciable to the undrinkable.



In the New World, Viognier is planted just about everywhere. In Australia, some of the best offerings are just as seductive as the finest Condrieus; while those of California have been steadily gaining in both quantity and quality. Viognier is also found in Chile, Argentina, South Africa, New Zealand, and even Canada.

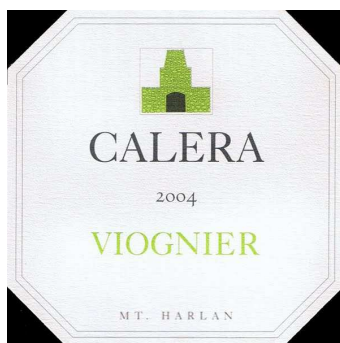
It is also interesting to note that Viognier is being increasingly used as a blending component with various red grapes, most notably Syrah/Shiraz. Fermented at the same time (known as 'co-pigmentation'), adding around 5% Viognier contributes both aroma



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and finesse to the wine, as well as enhances its colour. In the Northern Rhône appellation of Côte-Rôtie, this practice has been commonplace for decades, and is also on the increase in places like Australia and California.



But Viognier shall always be celebrated as an unblended white wine par excellence. Served at around 10-12°C, its texture should always be soft and enveloping, with a finish to both match and compliment the initial flavours detected. Most Viognier will not age more than a few years, and is one of few dry wines that actually performs better as an aperitif. However, if food is a must-have,

herbed lemon chicken will probably do nicely. Just be sure the wine's creaminess—its wonderful perfumed creaminess—is not hindered.

## A few gems for collectors:

### White Wines:

**Domaine de Chevalier Blanc 2010, Pessac-Léognan AOC, Bordeaux, France:** The greatest Chevalier Blanc ever? All signs point to an emphatic affirmative! Pale lime in colour, Olivier Bernard's monumental '10 yields stunning scents of pears, passion fruit, lemon citrus, subtle orange zest, kiwi, white chalk, white flowers, and a hint of lime, quince, vanilla pods, and nuts. Extremely complex and compact at this stage, nonetheless delivering extraordinarily elegant fruit, perfect acidity, and a fantastic, luminous hint of pears, minerals, citrus oils, and dried nuts on the finish. Brilliantly sculpted, possessing unbelievable intensity, finesse, balance, and harmony. Words cannot describe how much I admire this wine. 85% Sauvignon Blanc and 15% Sémillon. Now-2032++. **Château Pape Clément Blanc 2010, Pessac-Léognan AOC, Bordeaux, France:** Reflecting the style of the estate, Bernard Magrez's prodigious 2010 Pape Clément Blanc, the most enveloping white wine of the vintage, is an exercise in unfettered indulgence and renewal. Pale lime in colour with a touch of straw, it displays astounding scents of fragrant pears, star fruit, white flowers, kiwi, orange zest, minerals, nuts, and spice. Beguilingly complex, featuring incredibly elegant, poignant fruit, brilliant acidity, and a fantastically elegant, decadent hint of pears, lemon citrus, and delicate butterscotch on the finish. Quite heavenly, with astounding depth, flavour, and nerve. 52% Sauvignon Blanc, 34% Sémillon, 8% Sauvignon Gris, and 6% Muscadelle. Now-2030++. (Julian Hitner, The Successful Collector, June 2012)

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## **Château Smith Haut Lafitte Blanc 2010, Pessac-Léognan AOC, Bordeaux, France:**

Similar to the '07 only much more prodigious, the 2010 Smith Haut Lafitte Blanc is the best white wine Florence and Daniel Cathiard have ever produced. Pale lime in colour with a trace of straw, this striking jewel displays wonderful, inspiring scents of mildly tropical pears, apricots, lemon citrus/lemongrass, pineapple, kiwi, minerals, and a hint of nuts. Truly complex, possessing amazingly vibrant, elegant fruit, arresting acidity, and a magnificently refined hint of lemon citrus, ripe pears, and kiwi on the finish. Absolutely captivating, stylish, and harmonious, not to mention one of the most intense examples I have ever tasted from here. 90% Sauvignon Blanc, 5% Sémillon, and 5% Sauvignon Gris. Now-2030+. ## **Château Carbonnieux Blanc 2010, Pessac-Léognan AOC, Bordeaux, France:**

Likely the best Carbonnieux Blanc ever conceived, the 2010 most closely resembles the '08 (which I prefer to the '07), only with greater concentration and intensity. Pale lime in colour with a touch of straw, this beauty reveals exquisitely refined scents of ripe citrus pears and lemon; giving way to star fruit, minerals, nuts, and a hint of lanolin—all very youthful and tight at the moment. Very complex, boasting impeccable, vibrant minerally fruit, balanced acidity, and a lingering, engrossing hint of pears, lemon citrus, and kiwi on the finish. Brilliantly integrated and styled, this is certainly Anthony Perrin's most generous white wine to date. Bravo! 65% Sauvignon Blanc and 35% Sémillon. Now-2025++. ## **Château Malartic-Lagravière Blanc 2010, Pessac-Léognan AOC, Bordeaux, France:**

Under its present owners Alfred-Alexandre and Michèle Bonnie, Château Malartic-Lagravière is currently one of the fastest-improving estates in Pessac-Léognan. Pale straw-lime in colour, the 2010 Blanc features exceptional, confident scents of pears, lemon citrus, Life Savers®, lime, quince, passion fruit, and a hint of orange zest and minerals. Very complex, carrying outstandingly vibrant, finesse-laden fruit, balanced acidity, and a magnificent hint of pears, minerals, and star fruit on the finish. With amazing grace and vitality, this will easily keep for over ten years, perhaps more if stored in correct conditions. 85% Sauvignon Blanc and 15% Sémillon. Now-2023+. ## **La Chablisienne 2009, Chablis Premier Cru Vaurorent AOC, Burgundy, France:**

Few operations in Chablis have improved as rapidly as the Cave Coopérative la Chablisienne, a body accounting for roughly one-quarter of all production in the region. Pale lime in colour with a touch of straw, the 2009 Vaurorent displays elegant, delicate scents of pears, green apples, mild quince, lemon, flint, and a beautiful hint of smoke. Complex, with refined fruit, balanced acidity, and a focused, subtle hint of pears, green apples, and minerals on the finish. Remarkably expressive, showcasing first-rate delicacy and finesse. **Reichsgraf von Kesselstatt 2006 Riesling Kabinett, QmP Scharzhofberger, Mosel-Saar-Ruwer, Germany:** Top bargain for Kabinett lovers, the 2006 Reichsgraf von

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Kesselstatt (remembering that '06 was considered a lesser vintage) is both enveloping and finesse-driven. Light lime in colour with a touch of straw, the wine is aging superbly, offering beautiful scents of sweet lemon blossom, white peaches, green grapes, pears, kerosene, and spice. Complex, with elegant off-dry fruit (very fulsome), balanced acidity, and a marvellous hint of sweet green grapes and kerosene on the finish. ## **Chateau Ste. Michelle 2008 Eroica Riesling, Columbia Valley, Washington State:**

Joint venture between Ernst Loosen of the Mosel and Chateau Ste Michelle, the Eroica label has fast emerged as one of the finest Rieslings in the Pacific Northwest. Very pale straw-lime in colour, it exhibits absolutely lovely scents of white peaches, fresh lemonade, and lemon citrus; giving way to lime, dried pears, cordial, and the slightest hint of kerosene and spice. Complex, with great fruit, vibrant acidity, and a lingering, elegant hint of pure lemon citrus, white peaches, and minerals on the finish. Beautiful expression and style. Now-2016. ## **La Crema 2010 Chardonnay, Sonoma Coast (Sonoma County), California:**

Better than the '09, the 2010 Sonoma Coast Chardonnay boasts a deliciously 'limpid' feel about it. Pale-light greenish-lime in colour, it is finely toasted, offering beautiful scents of ripe pears, butterscotch, apricots, clementines, lemon, and a hint of vanilla and nuts. Complex, with great fruit, balanced acidity, and a lingering, elegant hint of pears, caramel, and nut traces on the finish. Very tempting, La Crema seems to have been quietly upping its game over the past several years. Now-2017+. (Julian Hitner, The Successful Collector, July 2012)

## **Domaine Latour-Giraud 2009, Meursault Les Narvaux AOC, Burgundy, France:**

One of the best non-Premier Cru sites in Meursault, white Burgundy collectors should find the 2009 Les Narvaux a great little specimen. Pale-light straw-lime in colour, the oxidative influence is slightly uplifted at first, offering expressive, 'contemplative' scents of pears, lemon, nuts, mild orange peel, apricots, and white flowers. Complex, with beautiful fruit, balanced acidity, and a round, texturally engaging hint of pears and roasted nuts on the finish. Fulsomely coated, this is nonetheless meant for earlier drinking, before full-on oxidation takes too great a hold. Now-2015. (Julian Hitner, The Successful Collector, July 2012)

## **Whitehaven 2011 Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, South Island, New Zealand:**

Superior Marlborough Sauvignon, the 2011 Whitehaven has all the makings of a benchmark wine. Pale lime in colour with a touch of straw, it exhibits very intense scents of gooseberries, lemongrass, white peaches and grapefruit, minerals, and a hint of herbs and cat's pee. Complex, with extremely zesty fruit, bracing acidity, and a lingering, rather emphatic hint of gooseberries and lemongrass on the finish. Expressive and confident, a few bottles would enhance any wine cellar. Screwcap closure. Now-2013. (Julian Hitner, The Successful Collector, July 2012)

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**Bernard Reverdy & Fils 2010, Sancerre AOC, Loire, France:** One of at least three wineries in the appellation with the last name 'Reverdy' (no doubt the families are related), the 2010 Sancerre is very pure, elegant, and suitably intense. Pale lime in colour, it reveals heightened scents of gooseberries, lemongrass, white grapefruit, green apples, and a hint of dried pears and flint. Complex, boasting beautiful fruit, balanced acidity, and a refined hint of gooseberries and green apples on the finish. Very lovely. Now-2015+. (Julian Hitner, The Successful Collector, July 2012)

**Jean-Marc Brocard 2010 Chablis Premier Cru Vaucopin AOC, Burgundy, France:** Surrounded entirely by generic Chablis parcels, this is one of few notes I have from the Vaucopin vineyard; though it is a most admirable recording. Pale-straw lime in colour, the 2010 Jean-Marc Brocard features appreciably understated scents of green apples and pears; giving way to lemon, flint, and wet stones. Complex, delivering heightened nervy fruit, balanced acidity, and a highly minerally hint of green apples and pears on the finish. Lovely texture, balance, and nerve. Now-2016. **Esk 2008 Black Label Sauvignon Blanc, Hawke's Bay, North Island, New Zealand:** One of only several notes I have from this winery, the 2008 Black Label is a beautiful Sauvignon Blanc. Pale straw-lime in colour, the wine exhibits delightfully understated scents of grassy quince, light lemon and lime, quince, a few green pears, and a hint of wet stones. On the palate: lovely racy fruit showing, with good acidity, and a refreshing hint of lemongrass and wet stones on the finish. Truly an original. Screwcap closure. Now-2010. Pale lime in colour, the 2008 Awatere-based Sauvignon Blanc offers intense scents of pebbly-grassy, almost 'icy' gooseberries; giving way to lemon, melon, and cat's pee. On the palate: heightened zesty fruit showing, with good acidity, and a lovely hint of gooseberries on the finish. Textbook style for the most part, both extremely identifiable and refreshing. Pale straw-lime in colour, it starts off with grassy/dewy gooseberries, lemon, lime, cat's pee, wet stones, and a hint of seasalt. On the palate: lovely polished fruit showing, with balanced acidity, and a stylish hint of gooseberries and lemon on the finish. Highly personable and balanced. Screwcap closure. Now-2010. 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**Wairau River 2008 Sauvignon Blanc, Wairau Valley (Marlborough), South Island, New Zealand:** My first note from this winery, the 2008 Sauvignon Blanc is unusually finely structured and balanced. Pale straw-lime in colour, it presents subtle notes of limy lemongrass, gooseberries, wet stones, and cat's pee. On the palate: good zesty fruit showing, with vibrant acidity, and a rather vivid hint of lemongrass and cat's pee on the finish. Crisp, fresh, and appealing. Screwcap closure. Now-2010. On the palate: very good, refreshing fruit showing, with slightly milder acidity, and a splendid hint of pears and mild butterscotch on the finish. Light straw-lime in colour, the 2011 Altenbourg Gewurztraminer features lovely, slightly reserved notes of spicy lemon and lychees; switching to gingerroot, flint, and a hint of jasmine and peaches. **Domaine de Bois St-Denis 2010, Reuilly AOC, Loire, France:** One of several lesser-known AOCs situated in the Upper Loire, the best Reuilly Sauvignons have improved with resounding speed over the past several years. Very pale lime in colour, the 2010 Domaine de Bois St-Denis provides splendid notes of gooseberries, dried pears, lemon, white grapefruit, and minerals. On the palate: refreshing steely fruit showing, with vibrant acidity, and a hint of gooseberries and green apples on the finish. Very crisp and balanced. Now-2013. **Chalkers Crossing 2008 Hilltops Semillon, New South Wales, Australia:** With grapes sourced through the entirety of NSW (theoretically), the 2008 Hilltops Semillon is noticeably well crafted. Pale straw-lime in colour, it offers engaging notes of ripe green apples, light caramel, lanolin, melon dew, and a hint of Bartlett pears. On the palate: good mellow fruit showing, with balanced acidity, and a hint of ripe green apples and dried caramel on the finish. Good character and balance. Now-2011+. 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2008 Clairault, though somewhat closed at the moment, hints at notes of mild stone fruit, lemon, and a hint of stony beach pebbles. On the palate: good mellow fruit showing, with balanced acidity, and a hint of green apples and lemon on the finish. Enjoyable and balanced. 57% Semillon and 43% Sauvignon Blanc. Screwcap closure. **Hiedler 2010 Thal Premier Cru Grüner Veltliner, Kamptal DAC, Niederösterreich, Austria:** Under a new classification system introduced several years ago, member-wineries belonging to the Traditionsweingüter Österreich may list wines hailing from specific vineyards as 'Erste Lagen' (or 'Premier Cru'). Pale straw-lime in colour, the 2010 Thal Grüner Veltliner reveals elegant, crisp notes of green apples, white lentils, mild seasalt, wet stones, and a hint of straw. On the palate: good crisp fruit showing, with balanced acidity, and a delightful hint of yellow plums on the finish. Refreshing and balanced, sporting a good attitude. Screwcap closure. Now-2015+. **Chateau Ste. Michelle 2008 Chardonnay, Columbia Valley, Washington State:** Good for the style, the 2008 Chardonnay merits attention. Pale straw-lime in colour, the wine is lightly toasted, boasting decent notes of pears and butterscotch; switching to dried apricots, green apples, and a hint of kiwi and lemon. Michelle performs as it should. Very pale lime in colour, it offers fresh notes of lemongrass, pears, lemon, and a hint of green apples and stony beach pebbles. Palate: light, crisp fruit showing, with balanced acidity, and a hint of lemony green apples on the finish. Refreshing and balanced. Now-2010. (Julian Hitner, The Successful Collector, June 2010)

Light straw-lime in colour, the 2008 Grain Sauvage displays lemon blossom at the outset, with notes of nectarines, apricots, orange peel, and spice. Palate: good fruit showing, with balanced acidity, and a pleasant hint of fresh lemony orange blossom (very dry) on the finish. Solid expression and balance. Now-2011++. **Fontanafredda 2009, Gavi del Comune di Gavi DOCG, Piedmont, Italy:** One of few notes I have on this type of wine, the 2009 Gavi del Comune di Gavi is both easygoing and fresh. Pale straw-lime in colour, it offers pleasant notes of leafy green apples, light floral notes, and a hint of stony beach pebbles. On the palate: light, dry leafy fruit showing, with balanced acidity, and a hint of herbed green apples and lemon traces on

## Red Wines:

**Col d'Orcia 1980, Brunello di Montalcino Riserva DOCG, Tuscany, Italy:** Having tasted only a handful of extra-old Brunellos, it was an especial treat to examine such an astonishing wine as the 1980 Col d'Orcia Riserva. Dark cherry-red brick in colour, it exudes a positively radiant, potent bouquet of cigarbox and dried red fruits; switching to garrigue, sandalwood, savoury underbrush, mahogany, cedar, roasted meats, and exotic spices. Extremely complex, possessing gorgeously mature fruit, finely integrated tannins, balanced acidity, and a lingering, instrumentally elegant hint of savoury/cedary cigarbox and underbrush on the finish. Traditional, quite powerful, and classically crafted. Easily the greatest wine I have ever tasted from here. Now-2016. (Julian Hitner, The Successful Collector, November 2009)

**Clos Apalta 2008, Colchagua Valley, Chile:** One of the all-time Chilean greats, the 2008 Clos Apalta is unequivocally the most profound, seductive vintage yet from Viña Lapostolle's flagship label. Opaque ruby in colour, the wine is beautifully toasted, expressing marvellous aromas of blackberries, crème de cassis, 'silky' mocha, black cherries, blueberries, graphite, charcoal, vanilla, and spice. Very complex, featuring sensationally layered, whimsical fruit, firm tannins, slightly milder acidity, and a lasting, supremely integrated hint of mocha and currants on the finish. Fits like a velvet glove: magnificent, precise, even elegant. 73% Carmenère, 17% Cabernet Sauvignon, and 10% Merlot. Now-2030++. (Julian Hitner, The Successful Collector, March 2011)

**Château Troplong Mondot 2008, St-Emilion Grand Cru Classé AOC, Bordeaux, France:** A candidate for wine of the vintage, the 2008 Troplong Mondot is, from what I can tell, one of the most powerful blends owner-winemaker Christine Valette has ever fashioned. Dark-opaque ruby in colour, this amazing bottling is beautifully toasted, expressing dangerously alluring aromas of mocha and Oreo Cookies®, switching to currants, plums, black cherries, graham crackers, charcoal, subtle tarry traces, vanilla, and spice. Truly complex and multilayered, featuring powerful yet elegant fruit, firm tannins, balanced acidity, and a lasting, abundant hint of currants and espresso on the finish.
